Dear All,

The newsletter this month is early for a very good reason. I am on holiday for the last two weeks of March and I wanted to pass on the information about a great new opportunity from the Library for the Easter Holidays and beyond. In addition, we are also now thinking about the Summer Holidays.



Following a successful pilot at Christmas, we are hoping to place workers sponsored by Wigwam at the Playscheme during the Summer Holidays, giving a possible 120 days of supported places at £26 a day, £13 a half day per child.

(Support will be available for families who will find paying that amount a struggle; please feel free to contact me confidentially if that is the case when applying).

We will also pay for any second child or more children from one family. Places will be available for children who have just finished Reception to those who have just finished Year 5 (4- to 10-year-olds).

The next step will be that in May I will ask parents to contact me and let me know how many days or half days you would like. This will be to indicate to us and the Youth Commission whether we will need one or two sponsored workers and to work out the logistics of transport and whether Wigwam will need to support this.

In June you will be contacted at the same time as applications for the Playscheme opens to complete the application form and send in payment to secure your place with the Youth Commission.

Please don't do anything about this yet, I will let you know when to register your interest.

Autism Drop-In Sessions at the Library

Throughout April the Guille-Allès Library is running a series of Autism drop-in sessions for children.

We are very keen to ensure we're providing a positive and welcoming experience for people with autism, and we would like to become known as an Autism Friendly Library. We can already provide a range of sensory relief items in the Children's Library, and we have been working closely with Autism Guernsey and with fellow libraries in the UK to plan our next steps.



These new sessions will run every Thursday afternoon in April, 16.30-18.30, in the Children's Library. The aim is to provide a time when families of autistic children can visit the library and know to expect a welcoming and inclusive experience in an environment tailored for their needs. This will include:

- Dimmed lighting and reduced noise levels in the Children's Library.
- Sensory equipment including headphones, lap pillows and fidget toys.
- Signs to raise awareness of the sessions.
- Directional signs to assist users to find their way around.
- Social story on the Library website under 'Accessibility.'

In addition, there will be a Calm Room available for families in the Dorey Room on the second floor. Our trained staff will be on hand to ensure their visit to the Library is a positive one.

At 17.00pm each week there will be a story session run by my colleague Abi, who has extensive experience working with Autistic children and their families.
